Protection of children effected by HIV, or living with family members effected by HIV, is central to the IICCHAA program. Long term, they require schooling and financial stability, but the first step is to reduce the stigma that surrounds HIV, so they're not rejected by their communities.

To plan their child's future the family needs resources. IICHAA helps parents access government entitlements and to earn an income, building their financial independence and future security.

CINI met Ruhana when she was on the streets with her 8-year-old son. He was not in school and she was living life as an "untouchable", begging to make a living.

The IICHAA program, supported and encouraged Ruhana to put her son in school, where he is now safe. She has learned about HIV and regularly gets medication. She received a government grant, opened her own bank account and has a job. She has a safe place to talk about her worries and is making plans for her little boy's future. Ruhana and her son are just one of many families supported by the IICCHAA program, who have begun to plan their future and build their path out of poverty.
